

# **Residents' Association Committee meeting – May 2017**

A Meeting of the Committee took place on Tuesday, 9<sup>th</sup> May 2017. In addition to Committee members, Councillors Rod Ashford, Bob Gardner & Simon Parnall were in attendance.

## **Matters arising**

- The Chairman provided an update on the potential acquisition of a defibrillator including costing, siting & insurance.
- The Chairman opened a discussion on the Pavilion in the Recreation Ground and a number of potential issues were identified.

## **Councillor Gardner reported on:**

- A series of recent instances of vandalism – including two separate instances of damage to the Bowls Club's shed and another of damage to the perimeter fence. In addition to the cost of repairing/replacing the shed, the Bowls Club are planning to install CCTV.
- The state of the road surface at the Chipstead Lane roundabout was highlighted and Cllr. Gardner responded that this was scheduled for resurfacing.

## **Councillor Ashford reported on:**

- The state of the Recycling Area in Stubbs Lane, which continues to be misused. He added that discrete CCTV cameras were now in place and these would be used by the JET enforcement team to identify those misusing the facility and, where practicable, prosecute offenders.
- Fly-tipping continues to be a problem particularly in more isolated areas, both Borough Councillors asked that they and/or the JET enforcement team should be notified of any instances of fly-tipping; they added that any (discretely taken) photographic evidence of the offence taking place would be very helpful.
- It was reported that a number of youngsters riding mopeds were causing problems for residents in various parts of the Village, with several of the youngsters being described as not wearing helmets. Cllr. Ashford asked that details of the number plates should be forwarded to him.

## **Crime report:**

- In addition to the instances of vandalism discussed earlier, it was reported that two break-ins to vans had recently taken place.
