POST OFFICE QUESTIONNAIRE

It should be noted that a number of official complaints have been made and it is likely that the offender(s) may well face action from the Council.

Can we please remind those dog-owners who are exercising their pets that there are a number of bins located in the Recreation Ground specifically for depositing dog mess.

HAVE YOUR SAY ON LOCAL TRANSPORT

Surrey County Council is carrying out a review of local transport services in the county, covering bus services, community transport and concessionary travel.

The Council has launched a public consultation, running until 14th January 2015, and plans will only be drawn up after residents have had an opportunity to have their say.

Dear Residents

During the last few months we have worked with a significant number of Lower Kingswood residents who have come to us with a range of problems and difficulties: housing, parking, refuse collection, the traveller incursion onto the recreation ground, public health and various planning related issues. As ward councillors we are ready to tackle problems for you - so please don't hesitate to call or write to me or to my colleagues - Councillors Joan Spiers and Ros Mill - if you think we can help. We work closely with County Councillor Bob Gardner, who handles a different range of topics and - between ourselves - we'll work out who is best placed to help you.

I would like to pick up one issue from the list above - planning - which relates not only to what you might want to do with your own property, but where you have concerns about developments that neighbours are planning or (as sometimes happens) executing without existing permission to your knowledge. We are here to help you in any of these situations - maybe to point you at the right way to apply for permission or to make your comments about others' plans, or to seek the help of officers when things are clearly not right.

Finally, when the traveller incursion onto the recreation ground happened a few months back the Police, Councillors and Officers became involved, but so did the community - and I was so impressed to see how young people from Lower Kingswood went out and played football with the travellers' children. We listened to one young man's account of his interaction, building a bridge that helped significantly in bringing the situation to resolution quickly and peacefully. Our thanks go to him and to his friends for what they did.

Residents' Association

Committee reports

A Meeting of the Committee took place on Tuesday, 8th July 2014. In addition to Committee members, Councillors Joan Spiers & Ros Mill were in attendance.

Councillor Spiers reported on:

- The appointment of CIIr. Victor Broad as the new Leader of the Borough Council.
- The approval of the Council's Core Strategy.
- The current situation regarding outstanding work in Woodhatch & Nork. The issues of potential improvements to the car park and playground facilities in Lower Kingswood's recreation ground were raised; Cllr. Spiers responded that the issue was funding and, given the continuing financial constraints, these could not be dealt with in the immediate future.

Councillor Mill reported on:

 Her newly amended Portfolio, which included sport. She added that this would include such matters as the proposed improvement of the BMX facility in the recreation ground and she would be monitoring the situation.

Other matters included:

- The on-going parking issue in Buckland Road caused by football teams using the recreation ground (particularly on Sundays) was discussed. It was conceded that any mitigation might have to wait until such time as the parking facilities in the recreation ground were improved.
- It was again noted that, although already officially reported, the pedestrian traffic lights (on the southbound A217/Brighton Road) were still defective and taking an inordinate time to change and allow pedestrians to cross.

A Meeting of the Committee took place on Tuesday, 9th September 2014. In addition to Committee members, Councillors Bob Gardner & Simon Parnall were in attendance.

Councillor Parnall reported on:

- The current situation regarding two specific planning applications.
- His suggestion regarding the development of a 'Village Plan' (as an adjunct to the Borough Council's Core Strategy) and cited the plans recently developed for both Kingswood & Burgh Heath. After lengthy discussion, it was agreed that the Association would form a sub-Committee to pursue this matter.

Councillor Gardner reported on:

Remedial work that would soon be undertaken by the County Council on verges and footpaths in Lower Kingswood, especially along Mint Lane, Beechen Lane and the A217/Brighton Road. It was pointed out that there were specific issues in the vicinity of Holly Lodge and the junction of Green Lane with the A217.

- His wish to have a pedestrian crossing installed in the vicinity of Holly Lodge, which would be of particular benefit to the local residents.
- Complaints that had been made about the size of some of the trees in Buckland Road and noted that these would be trimmed in the near future.
- Various issues in respect of yellow lines, which had been introduced into parts of Lower Kingswood. He added that much of this work had been undertaken at the behest of residents and noted that parking was time limited.
- It was reported that the phasing of the pedestrian traffic lights (on the southbound A217/Brighton Road) was still defective. It was also noted that, although traffic generally slowed for the speed camera by the recreation ground, vehicles then tended to accelerate towards the Buckland Road/Smithy Lane/A217 junction and thence the pedestrian crossing.
- It was reported that the speed of traffic using both the local roads in Lower Kingswood and the A217/Brighton Road continued to be a major concern; in the ensuing discussion a number of possible ideas were put forward.

It was reported that a number of residents in some of the roads in the village were seeking approval to "drop" the kerbs so as to be able to park their vehicle(s) on the frontage of their property, it was noted that this could in turn exacerbate parking issues. Cllr. Gardner added that the costs associated with making such an application were not inconsiderable.

Dear Residents

ROADS

An action plan to keep Surrey moving in severe winter weather was approved at the end of November.

More than £2.5 million is being spent on a programme that includes using more than 40 specialist vehicles, hi-tech monitoring equipment, weather stations and 16,000 tonnes of grit to prepare for the winter ahead.

At a meeting of Surrey County Council's Cabinet, the Winter Service Plan was given the green light. Highlights include:

- Providing 39 gritters fitted with location trackers and salt spreading monitors
- Installing six weather stations providing real-time updates on air and road temperature, rainfall and salt and ice levels
- Preparing more than 1,800 roadside salt bins across Surrev
- Extending a trial of alternative vehicles like quad bikes in the winter clear-up
- Having a standby team of 51 farmers to give extra sup-

port in less accessible areas.

In a separate decision, the Council has also put aside £5 million extra into repairing the 200 roads in most need of fixing from cold weather damage.

RECYCLING

Surrey residents are being urged to recycle one extra plastic bottle a week and save the county over £200,000 a year to go back into frontline services.

Only 27 per cent of recyclable plastics - such as bottles, pots, tubs and trays - are currently being recycled in Surrey's households, and the County Council is supporting the national 'Pledge 4 Plastics' campaign (see www.pledge4plastics.co.uk) urging residents to recycle more.

If each of Surrey's 983,000 adults recycled one extra plastic bottle a week, it would save over £200,000 a year in waste disposal charges and ease the council's budget pressures in areas like the demand for school places, with an additional 13,000 such places already in the process of being created.

Surrey County Council's Cabinet Member for the Environment - Mike Goodman - recently commented: "Recycling helps us improve Surrey's environment and the council's finances, so this small pledge could reap big benefits. Once a plastic bottle has been collected, it can be reborn as a football shirt, children's toy, furniture or even a new bottle."

Anyone who pledges to recycle one extra bottle a week could win a limited edition mobile phone cover made from 80 percent recycled plastic bottles. Interior designer Abigail Ahern, who recently starred in Channel 4's 'Get Your House in Order', created it.

FLY TIPPING

I am sorry to report that this dreadful dumping of rubbish is back, we need to keep our eyes open to report this offence when it occurs, only this week in Gatton Bottom a pile of concrete was dumped on the verge, then just a few metres up the road, domestic waste was left on the other side of the road.

If you see any of these offences either in the act or rubbish being dumped, then report it to Reigate & Banstead Council please help us to keep Lower Kingswood (and Surrey) clean and fly tipping free.

Editor's Note

The mechanism for viewing crime statistics can be accessed from the national police website www.police.uk and this shows that, for the month of October 2014, there were a total of 19 instances of crime & anti social behaviour within a one mile radius of Lower Kingswood. These were made up of: anti social behaviour 7, bicycle theft 1, criminal damage & arson 1, drugs 1, other theft 8 and violence & sexual offences 1. This website also allows these instances to be viewed street by street! — and even show historic data back to 2011.

However, comments from our local police officers have previously indicated that Lower Kingswood itself continues to have relatively low levels of reported crime. Nevertheless you should notify Surrey Police immediately of any suspicious callers or people loitering in your area, any unfamiliar vehicles, or any suspicious activity at neighbouring properties.

Kingswood Primary School



Our new Reception class has been in school for nearly a term and has settled so well. One of our school priorities is to use the outdoors to enhance learning so Reception children are about to start using Margery Woods on a regular basis. The aim is to develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on learning experiences in a natural environment. It is very exciting for the children and I hope it proves to be a big success!

Since September the new National Curriculum has been implemented. It sets out higher expectations for children along with some changes to the subjects being taught. All Junior children will now learn a language on a regular basis and at Kingswood we have chosen French to link in with our trip to France in Year 6. The computing curriculum has changed significantly with an

emphasis on children learning how to program. Because of this, we have had to buy new equipment and train staff. The children's initial responses to their computer learning have been positive and enthusiastic.

At the beginning of the autumn term the school was successful in applying for 'Artsmark' status. This is a national award, which recognises schools that promote dance, drama, music and art within the curriculum and extracurricular activities. It gave staff a good opportunity to review the provision for our children and the school some areas to further develop.

In the middle of November the school held a curriculum themed week entitled 'Our place in the world'. It included learning about the importance of Remembrance Day,

finding out about different countries, including dances such as The Haka and The Capoeira and finished off with learning about the Children In Need charity through a "soak the teacher" fundraiser!

We are now approaching Christmas and this is always an exciting and busy time of the school year as children will be practising

their Christmas plays and performing to their parents/carers. On that note I hope everyone has a happy and peaceful Christmas.





The Residents' Association has recently received details from Surrey County Council of a public consultation exercise that they are undertaking into its spending on supporting local bus services, community transport and concessionary travel.

They have asked for our assistance in advising residents about the consultation and encouraging participation. Quoting from the accompanying letter:

"Increased demand for essential services such as adult social care and school places, means Surrey County Council needs to review its spend on all the services it provides for the county's residents."

"As part of this we are carrying out a review of local transport services in Surrey, covering bus services, community transport and concessionary travel."

"The aim of the review is to make savings while maintaining the services that residents rely on most. To achieve this, we have launched a public consultation, running until 14 January 2015, and plans will only be drawn up after residents have had their say."

On the subject of public transport, Lower Kingswood residents are probably aware that our two local bus services (420 – Sutton to East Surrey Hospital via Reigate/Redhill and 460 – Epsom to Crawley via Reigate/Redhill) each only run at hourly intervals and start at around 5:00am and finish by around 7:00pm.

However, there is a possible alternative – the National Express 'A3' coach service from London (Victoria Coach Station) to Gatwick (North & South Terminals). This is a 24-hour service with one coach every hour in each direction with, obviously, intermediate stops en route; in Lower Kingswood the stops are those near/opposite the Royal Gurkha/Fox on the Hill.

Fares from Lower Kingswood to Gatwick start from £6.30 (single) with a journey time of around 30 minutes and, from Lower Kingswood to Victoria Coach Station, fares start from £9.80 (single) with a journey time of around 1 hour 15 minutes. Return fares are generally some 25% cheaper than two single fares and there a number of other "discounted" journey options.
