
Chairman's Report

These have been shared with Reigate and Banstead Council, but unfortunately, we haven't been able to move forward as the meeting to discuss them had to be postponed. Hopefully, it will be rescheduled, and I can

update everyone on the council's response.

As I write this update, members of the Lower Kingswood Residents Association spent the previous weekend putting up Poppies in our area; I hope residents enjoy them and pause to think for a second what they represent. We laid a wreath on behalf of our residents at the Remembrance Sunday parade in Banstead. We understand it was well attended with an increasing number of young people attending. Whilst putting up the poppies, we saw the beauty of our area and some of the challenges. Litter was the first thing I noticed. Our local litter pickers do a fantastic job. I can only empathise with their frustration that as soon as they clear an area, some

thoughtless individuals discard their rubbish rather



inadequacies. This reminded me that Rebecca Paul, one of our local County Councillors, recently raised a petition suggesting an improved formula of central government funding to maintain and improve our road network; I know she handed it to No 10. Hopefully, they will respond to it positively, as it is a topic that impacts residents in Lower Kingswood and beyond. I know other Resident Associations have similar concerns. Maybe together, we can keep these issues at the forefront of local and central governments' minds.

On a more positive note, we are moving quickly towards Christmas, and the LKRA is planning to repeat last year's display of four Christmas trees. If anyone has any outdoor lights or decorations they want to donate, don't hesitate to contact me or any of our committee members. For those who wish to attend the Tadworth and Walton Christmas lights, they will be turning them on, on the 2nd of December at 4pm outside the shops in Station Approach, with many activities taking place during the afternoon and evening.

We understand residents are having issues with paying for carparking at the Horseshoe in Banstead, be assured our councillors are liaising with the company concerned to make the system more user friendly.

LOWER KINGSWOOD VILLAGE FÊTE 1st May, 2023 1.30-4.30 pm. in the Recreation Ground



The Humble Candle

Candles might not feature quite so largely in our 21st century lives as they did with our forebears. We're not so dependent on them as they were (although candles are very


handy if a power cut comes along!). We're perhaps more used nowadays to seeing them in comedy programmes (did Hyacinth Bouquet's candle-lit suppers ever take place?), and the Two Ronnies' four candles sketch lives on in the memory. We're also used to seeing candles in period costume dramas.

But it's in our church lives that candles play the most important role nowadays - on the altar reminding us that Christ is the light of the world, in memorial candles lit to the memory of loved ones, and we still

experience the excited anticipation of a candle light Carol Service.

Sometimes when I think of candles, one particular image comes to mind. A picture by a Dutch artist - Gerard von Honthorst - entitled 'Christ before the High Priest.' A marvellous use of light with the High Priest seated at a table on which a single candle burns. A passive Jesus stands the other side - their faces are highlighted - the High Priest wags an admonishing finger at the Christ who gazes serenely down at him. Shadowy officials lurk in the background, foretelling the brutality to come.


The picture is of immense intensity - it draws us into its very substance and immerses us in what's happening. Incredibly, each time I look, although

The Old Pheasantry 'Where the Disadvantaged can find their wings'

Did you know that The Old Pheasantry was built in 1912, and a 110 years later, it has retained most of the original features. Think Downton Abbey meets Miss Marple!

Its almost 43 years since the Charity moved into the house, and despite the Pandemic and other challenges, the Charity is going from strength to strength.

We have improved the inside of the house for guests and made a lot of changes outside, but there's more to come.

In addition to planting more trees and shrubs around the house and gardens, and having taken advice from Surrey Wildlife Trust and The Woodland Trust, we are planning to turn the disused paddock area between Merrywood Grove and the motorway into a Wildlife area, complete with new pond, re-invigorating the old one, planting a couple of trees and shrubs (well over 200!) and making the stable into a teaching/resource centre, with water collection from the roof for the pond and planting.

We are looking to place new nesting boxes around the site as we hope to encourage far more flora and fauna into our neck of the woods.

Bet you didn't know that there is a tunnel for wildlife under the motorway, which had been blocked off, but we will re-open it next year.

Once complete we hope local residents will come and experience the area, especially children and young

adults, whether they are staying in The Old Pheasantry, or not. They will be welcome!

Health Matters

Winter is almost upon us and although Covid levels remain a concern, the illness seems milder than previously. If you catch Covid please isolate and stay at home for the first 5 days so as not to spread the infection. If you are vulnerable because of being immuno-suppressed or having a long-term condition such as diabetes, COPD, heart disease etc then consider wearing a mask to protect yourself. If you have Covid symptoms, which can be like a cold or sore throat, and need to see the doctor, if possible please test before your appointment and wear a mask.

The GPs, nurses and staff in general practice are at risk of exposure and if they pick it up, the practice will be short of staff. This puts pressure on the service the practice can provide and their ability to see you.

Kingswood Primary School



Bowling Green Building

On a positive note, the council have cut the grass on the old bowling green to make it a usable space again.



Surrey County Council Parking Review

The Surrey County Council parking review has now been completed for this year. In our area, they have decided to consult on installing double yellow lines on the north side of Mogador Road from the National Speed limit to the junction with Buckland Road. The explanation given is to improve sightlines and road safety. The other location is an extension of the double yellow lines in Smithy Lane to outside number 59; again, it is to improve sightlines and deal with parking issues. Notices have been posted at these locations giving details of the consultation process.

Local Asylum Seekers

A question has been raised with us regarding locating asylum seekers in this area. I can confirm that a small number of individuals seeking asylum have been housed at the Bridge House Hotel on Reigate Hill; they have registered their details with the Home Office and applied for leave to remain in the United Kingdom.

This is a Home Office-led programme and doesn't involve our local Council. How long they will stay with us is for the Home Office.
